WELCOME

This handbook is for you, a middle school student. In this book are some of the things you will want to know about middle school. Keep this book so that you will know where to find answers to many of the questions you may have about school. If you would like more help, ask one of your teachers or come to the counselor's office, room 124/125. We will be glad to help you if we can.

NON-DISCRIMINATORY STATEMENT

Students, parents, employees and others doing business with or performing services for the Osage Community School District are hereby notified that this school district does not discriminate on the basis of age (except students), race, religion, creed, sex, marital status, socio-economic status, national origin, sexual orientation, gender identity or disability in admission or access to, or treatment in, its programs and activities. SIGN-OUT SHEET

Under no circumstances is a student to leave school without receiving permission from the middle school office. Generally, permission to leave will not be given to the student unless the school has received permission from the parent/guardian. At any time when a student leaves the school grounds, he/she is required to "sign out" on a sheet located in the middle school office. If the student returns before school is out, he/she is to sign in and indicate the time of return. Students will then be given a pass to go back to class.

LOCKERS

You will be assigned a locker on registration day. Your locker is a place for your coat, books, and boots, while you are in school. Lockers should be kept in tidy condition and students are asked to not open any lockers but their own. Any trouble with lockers should be reported. Your combination is for you to know. If you do not want other people in your locker, keep your combination to yourself. **NO LOCKER COMBINATIONS WILL BE CHANGED DURING THE YEAR. ALSO, NO ONE IS PERMITTED TO SWITCH LOCKERS.** Students are advised not to leave money or valuable items in their lockers. If on occasion, a student has to bring something of value to school, he/she may leave it at the middle school office. Students are reminded that lockers are loaned to assigned students but remain at all times the property of and under control of the school. In case of suspected disorder or illegal activity, school authorities assume the right to open and search any or all lockers.

CHANGE OF CLASSES

A tone will signal the beginning and end of each class period. There will be a tone in the morning to start school and one in the afternoon at dismissal time. In order to do all of the things you need to do, you cannot remain in one classroom all day. Every 44 minutes you will go to a different teacher. Teachers will dismiss you at the proper time. Students are expected to maintain order in the hallways when passing between classes and before and after school.

Every 44 minutes is called a period. There are eight periods in each school day. You have three minutes between classes.

If you need to go from one room to another while classes are in session, you will need to fill out the hallway pass section in your planners.

Fifth grade students will be on a modified schedule, which will not always be the same as the time schedule.

7th AND 8th ATHLETICS

All 7th and 8th boys and girls are welcome to try out for any of the sports offered in the athletics program. A physical examination and concussion form is required for participation in all athletics (including cheerleading). You will need to furnish your own towel for showering.

HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETIC GAMES

You will be able to attend all high school athletic games played by the senior high school. Admission to the games will be based on regular tickets or activity tickets purchased in advance.

STUDENT COUNCIL

Student council representatives will be selected by their classmates through an election in Homebase +. All students are eligible to become nominees and are encouraged to do so if they are interested in student government. The council meets at assigned times as deemed necessary by their advisor and the representatives themselves. Council members are responsible for class work they miss while attending meetings.

CAFETERIA

The cafeteria service is open to all students. Pupils who bring sack lunches from home may purchase milk.

The following are cafeteria regulations:

1. Keep your place in line, avoid crowding and pushing. (No moving up in line).
2. Be orderly at the table and observe proper table manners.
3. Leave the table and floor around your place in a clean condition for others.
4. Place all paper bags, straws, napkins, etc. in dispensers provided.
5. All milk cartons, dishes, and silverware must be returned to the cleaning counter.
6. Poor self-control in the cafeteria can result in disciplinary measures.

MEDIA CENTER

You may visit the media center before and after school and during your study hall. The librarian and your teacher will help you learn how to find and use books, magazines, and pamphlets. Books may be checked out for a two-week period.

RIDING THE SCHOOL BUS

Any student riding the school bus home, other than your own, needs to have a note from home cleared through the office. This includes all town students as well. The transportation department asks that no student have more than one guest rider accompanying them to or from school on the bus.

CLOTHING FOR PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Put your name on all articles of clothing. Each student must furnish his or her own combination padlock for your P.E. locker if they wish to use the locker.

Gym attire is required for P.E. (shorts, t-shirt, socks, gym shoes, etc.) for 6th, 7th, and 8th grades. Fifth grade students will wear their regular school clothes. White sweat socks or any sports socks are acceptable. Gym shoes are required. (No cleated shoes that carry in dirt, please.) You will need to furnish your own towel for showering.

ADVISOR - ADVISEE PROGRAM (HOMEBASE/GREENTIME)

Each student will be assigned a faculty member as their advisor. These Homebase/Greentime groups will meet daily and will perform a variety of functions throughout the school year. Your advisor is there to help you concerning any matter. Fifth Grade Advisors will be homeroom teachers.

TEXTBOOKS

Your teachers will assign books to you. Take good care of them. If one of the books is worn more than it should be, you will be required to pay for the unusual wear. If you lose a book, you will pay for it, also.

DISCIPLINE

The classroom teacher deals directly with cases of misbehavior. Individual conferences of the teacher and pupil involved often result in a better understanding and prevention of future misbehavior.

If a situation arises where it is necessary to dismiss a pupil from class immediately, they will then be sent to the principal.

THE COUNSELOR IS HERE TO HELP YOU

Have you ever wanted to talk with someone about a school or personal problem but didn't know where to go? This is where the counselor can help by trying to find an answer to your question. If you wish to meet with your counselor, come to the office (room 124/125) and make an appointment.

IF YOU ARE ABSENT

Parents are to call the middle school office on the morning their son or daughter is absent. Students are to bring a note from a parent or guardian stating the reason for the absence. If they forget the note, they are still to get an admit slip which will be marked "unexcused". When the note is brought the next day, the office records will be changed to "excused".

Eligibility Regulations: Any student who is absent from school on the day of an extracurricular event for any part or all of the class day shall be ineligible to participate in the event scheduled for that day unless the cause of his absence is of the type for which an excuse may be authorized. Authorization for absences on the day of the event should be obtained from the principal's office in advance of the absence. The provisions of the above regulation shall apply to student participation in all extracurricular activities of the school, such as athletics, band, vocal, dramatics, cheerleading and any other such activity.

TELEPHONE

If you need to use a telephone during school, permission must first be obtained from the office. However, the phone is for emergency use only. A phone is also available in the cafeteria for students' use, except when study hall is in session.

ASSEMBLIES

At various time, assemblies will be presented to the student body. Regardless of the type of program, courtesy demands that the student body be respectful and appreciative.

SCHOOL DINING SYSTEM

All buildings in the Osage Community Schools are now using the School Dining System. In the middle school there will be a keypad for you to enter your four digit ID number for both breakfast and lunch. These will be family accounts instead of individual accounts. You may deposit money into your family's account at any school office. Your four-digit lunch number will also be used to check materials out in the Media Center.

EMERGENCY DRILLS

Emergency drills are held at various times throughout the year. DO NOT RUN, but walk rapidly during an emergency drill. Remain silent so that necessary orders may be heard. All students will leave the building during a fire drill and will go to assigned areas during a tornado drill.

NURSE'S OFFICE

The school nurse is available in the middle school office. **If a student becomes ill or injured during school hours, he/she should inform their teacher and report to the middle school nurse.** In the event that a child is unable to finish a school day, parents or a designated responsible party will be notified **by the nurse or office personnel (students are not to contact parents before seeing school personnel).**

GRADING SYSTEM

In middle or senior high school, a grading system of A's, B's, C's, D's, and F's is used to grade subject work much the same as has been used in grade school. Each semester the honor roll for students who have earned an average of 3.0 (B) or higher in their subjects is posted on the school bulletin board and printed in the local paper.

CARE OF THE BUILDING

The custodians are members of the staff and are entrusted to provide us with the most comfortable, cleanest and neatest building they can. Your cooperation makes their job more pleasant. Waste paper baskets are provided in each classroom. Damaging or writing on walls or desks means more work for our custodians, so respect the work they do for us. Students who maliciously damage school property will be required to pay for the damage and could be subject to further disciplinary action.

SCHOOL ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE TIME

School begins at 8:10 a.m. each day. Students who are in the building before 7:45 a.m. are expected to be in the cafeteria or with a teacher. In most cases, there should be no reason for students to arrive at school before 7:45 a.m. If students are in the building after 3:30 p.m. they should be with a teacher or a coach.

STUDY HALLS

Study halls are designed to give students an opportunity to complete assignments in school. It is considered part of the curriculum and the same conduct of students that is expected in a classroom is also expected in study halls. Students should come to study hall fully prepared to study and have in their possession all of the needed books and supplies.

ELECTRONIC DEVICE STATEMENT

There should be no need for students to have cellphones, IPOD's, Kindles or other electronic devices in their possession during the school day. If you choose to bring these items to school, they should be used before or after school or in the classrooms as part of a school project, otherwise you risk having them taken away. The procedure that will be followed if an electronic device is taken from a student will be as follows:

- 1st offense: The item will be returned to the student at the end of the school day.
- 2nd offense: The item will be returned to the student's parent. Parent will be asked to come to school to pick it up.
- 3rd offense: The student will have 30 minutes of detention. Parent will be asked to come to school to pick it up.
- 4th & subsequent offense: The student will have 60 minutes of detention. Parent will be asked to come to school to pick it up.

CHANGING FROM ELEMENTARY SCHOOL TO MIDDLE SCHOOL

You will find many changes from grade school to middle school and you will need to handle each one as it comes. You will need to manage your time to carry out your part in music, athletics, leadership or whatever you decide to do and still have time to do your homework.

There is more freedom in middle school and more responsibilities on your part.

You will have a study period in each class, and you will have a number of study halls depending on your schedule. Use this time to get your work done and to go to the library.

DON'T LET THIS GET THE BEST OF YOU!

COMPULSORY ATTENDANCE LAW

Children are required by Iowa law to be in regular school attendance until they have reached the age of sixteen.

DRESS CODE

Our dress code will be determined by the following criteria:

1) decency 2) neatness 3) cleanliness 4) appropriateness for school.

Specifically -

Hats (or headbands) will be allowed only on designated days.

Clothes should cover any undergarments. Shirts must cover the midriff. No half shirts. No halter tops or spaghetti straps. No alcohol, tobacco, or drug related clothing will be permitted.

Shorts must be an appropriate length.

School personnel reserve the right to determine whether or not appearance and attire are appropriate for school. A student who is asked to alter their appearance or attire is expected to do so without question.

PLANNERS

Each student will receive a daily planner. The purpose of this planner is to encourage good study habits by providing a place to record assignments and activities. Students will also have the opportunity to use a digital planner. Regular use of a planner will enhance school success.

HOMEWORK

As students progress to and through Middle School, homework assignments are bound to increase. Organization, responsibility, using time wisely and the setting of study times outside of the school day will be important for Middle School success.

CONDUCT

Certain rules and regulations are necessary to insure that an educational environment is maintained. Conduct which may result in personal injury, property damage, injury to the spirit or reputation of the school or creating a disturbance in the classroom shall be grounds for disciplinary action. At the discretion of the principal, this action may result in detention after school, suspension from school, referral to juvenile authorities, recommended expulsion from school, or other appropriate action.

Therefore, each student is expected to abide by the following Iowa laws and approved school policies:

1. No student may willfully damage or deface school equipment or property.
2. School employees are neither required nor expected to accept abuse, annoyance, or interruptions from their normal educational functions by irresponsible, insubordinate, or disinterested students who apparently have no desire for an education.
3. Smoking or drinking by students on school property or in the school building shall be prohibited. The punishment for the first offense shall be a three-day, in-school suspension. Punishment for the second offense will be a three-day, in-school suspension and the parents and student may appear at the next scheduled school board meeting to show cause why the student should remain in school. On the third offense, the student shall be expelled from school for the remainder of the semester. Police authorities will be notified at the time of each offense.
4. Students riding on buses to and from school will be required to observe the rules of conduct as set forth by the school.
5. Harassment (bullying) of students will not be tolerated in the school district. Harassment includes, but is not limited to, racial, religious, national origin, age, disability and sexual harassment. Harassment by students is prohibited. Students whose behavior is found to be in violation of school policy will be subject to the investigation procedure which may result in discipline up to and including, suspension, expulsion, or other appropriate action.
6. Because of danger to health, safety, and property, snowballing and rock throwing is not permitted on the school grounds.
7. Truancy (skipping) is not acceptable conduct. Students absent because of truancy shall bring a parent or guardian to school on his or her return for a conference with the principal. Failure to comply will be considered as due cause for suspension for a period of three days. All missed time must be made up.
